Presentation Overview

Best Practices for Data Security & Governance

Data breaches by both privileged insiders and hackers continue to threaten organizations of all kinds. At the same time, new regulations such as SOX, PCI, GLBA, and data privacy laws are forcing organizations to implement tighter controls around sensitive information. This session will help you understand best practices for database security, data privacy, and data governance. It will describe a new category of network-resident, database activity monitoring technologies that provide both real-time database security and continuous auditing without impacting applications, databases, or networks. Finally, the session will describe how to leverage automation and standardization to simplify and reduce the cost of compliance.
