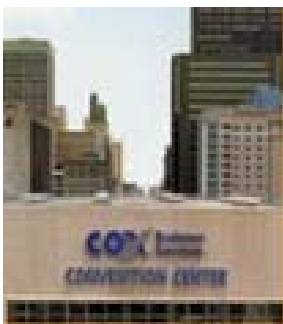

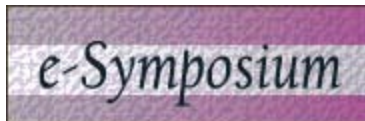

#### July Certifications

In July 2009, 335 Certified Information Systems Auditor™ (CISA®), 146 Certified Information Security Manager® (CISM®) and 7 Certified in the Governance of Enterprise IT® (CGEIT®) candidates were awarded certification.

#### December Exam Registration and Changes

The final registration deadline for the December 12, 2009 CISA, CISM and CGEIT exams is September 23, 2009. For those already registered, changes to registration information such as exam site or language, are free until Oct 10, 2009. US \$50 will be charged for all changes to exam registration information received between Oct 10 and Oct 16, 2009. No changes will be accepted after Oct 16, 2009. Contact [exam@isaca.org](mailto:exam@isaca.org) with any questions or change requests.

Candidates unable to take the exam may request a deferral of their registration fees to the next exam date. Deferral requests received on or before Oct 16, 2009 will be charged a US \$50 processing fee. From Oct 17 through Nov 25, 2009, a US \$100 fee will be charged. No deferrals will be accepted after Nov 25, 2009.

All exam registration and change deadlines are due by close of business at ISACA International Headquarters in Chicago, Illinois, USA: 5:00 p.m. CST. Visit [www.isaca.org/examdefer](http://www.isaca.org/examdefer) for further information.
